

Our Impact in 2024

2529 hotline calls were answered by our trained staff.2239 people reached through 34 trainings throughout

the year.

5,005 safe shelter nights were provided to **161** adults and children

315 Individual and group counseling sessions
5,885 Advocacy services provided to 1973 survisors
11,033 Healthy meals were fed to residents our our shelter program.



Success Story



I would like to thank the staff at Rise for all the work that they do. I sincerely believe that Rise helped save my life. It provided me with a safe and secure place to stay when I was getting out of a really bad, abusive situation. Not only that, it helped provide me with the resources I needed to restart my life, because when I had gotten out of my abusive relationship of 10 years I had no one left to turn to, as is often the case with survivors of domestic abuse. I had no money and my health was in a concerning state. They helped me get Medicaid and my first apartment in the area. I stayed there for about a month and the safe, clean and home-like environment helped give me confidence that there was a hopeful future ahead of me, alone, away from my abuser. They helped educate me about the cycles of abuse to help me avoid a similar situation in the future, and offered legal resources to protect me as well, helping to reinforce my fragile feeling of security at the time. And since I had barely anything except the clothes on my back when I got there, they were also able to help provide me with clothes and personal care items, and even some things for my new apartment when I was moving out. I honestly believe I owe my life now, as an independent hard working woman away from her abuser, to the work and support of the good people at Rise.

2024 Highlights




Rise was honored with the Community Changemaker award at the Let Us Dream conference held at the BU Downtown Center.

Quoting Rebecca Staudt in the Changemaker Community Spotlight:

"Without our incredible staff, we would not be able to provide services to a very vulnerable, and oftentimes overlooked, population. It takes an average of seven times before a victim permanently leaves an abusive relationship, and it takes a special person to be able to sit with someone through their experiences and trauma. Staff are trauma-informed and victim-centered, providing a non-judgmental space with information and education, to make sure that whomever reaches out leaves the conversation feeling heard, validated and with additional tools. This is why we have decided to spotlight all of our staff as Changemakers."


2024 Financials
